Subject: French

Length of exam: One hour.

They will do this via revising and learning the perfect and past tenses in French as well we using the new vocabulary we learn in class.

Subject: Spanish

Topics:

Pupils have been learning across a range of topics as they were introduced to Spanish this term. This includes: greetings and the Spanish alphabet; counting; days and months of the year; pencil case items and classroom furniture; describing pets; hair and eye colour and key hobbies. This also includes learning about Hispanic cultures and speaking changes in different, Spanish-speaking countries. They have also been learning key Spanish verbs (ser, ir, hacer, estar, tener) and have been introduced to the present tense in Spanish.
