Microsoft Teams is our online learning platform for both in lessons and at home. Over the summer, staff have worked hard to set up class groups for each student. Homework will be set this year using Microsoft Teams for each subject and it will also be the main platform for marking and feedback.

If a student is not in school for any reason, they can access lesson resources and materials by logging on to Microsoft Teams and messaging their teacher, or by going to the “files” and “assignments” sections of their class pages.

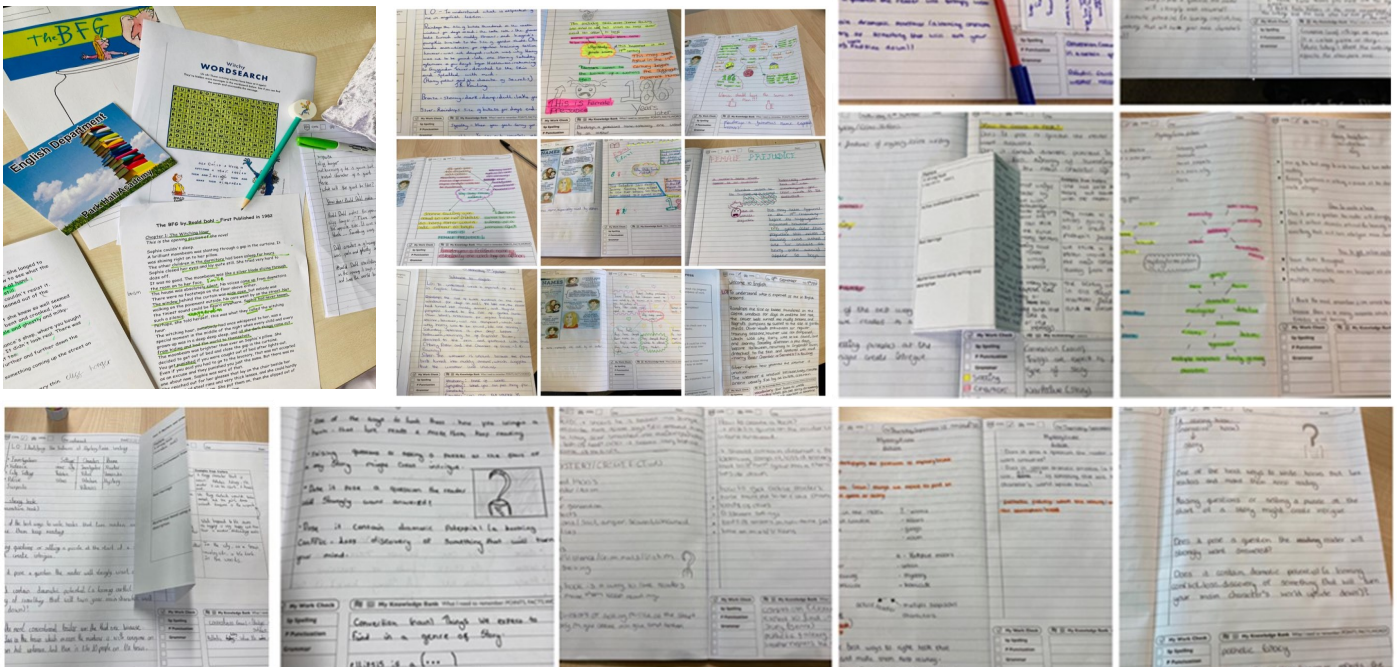

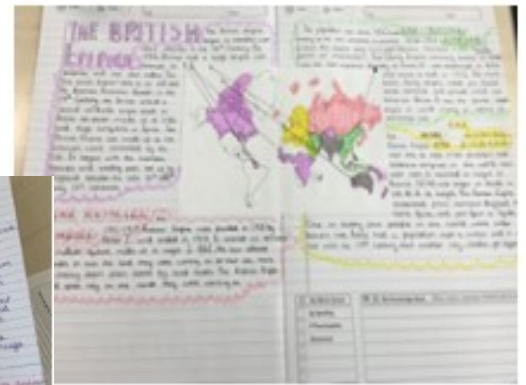
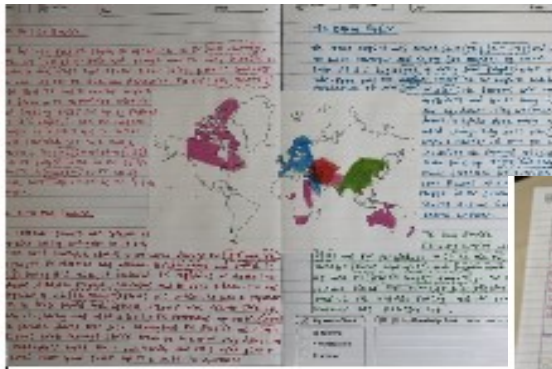
Miss Dodd is impressed with **English** classes **7J2** and **7B2** who have made an amazing start to English this year!

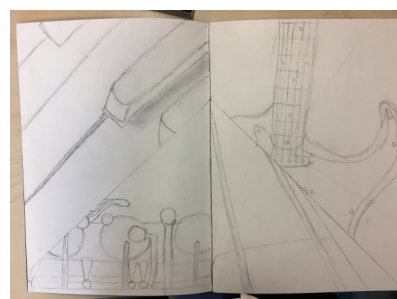
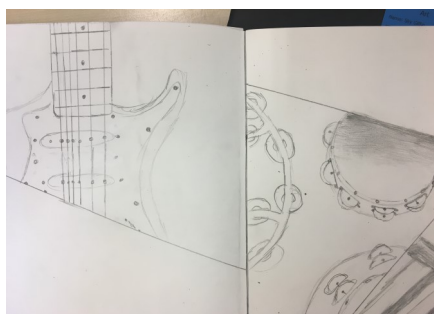
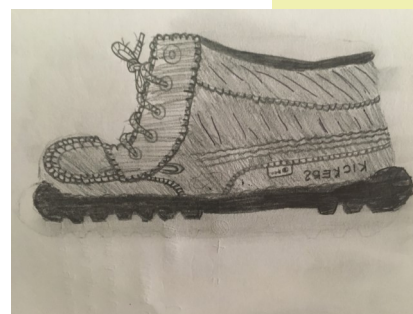
