We await further guidance on the government's plan for the wider re-opening of schools in March and I will write to you once we understand what the expectations are.


Many thanks for your support and understanding; we will be sending out more information and updates as we have more information to share.

The top 20 individuals will be announced, along with the highest form per year, the


highest department and which year group achieved the highest amount!

With only 18 months to go the Commonwealth Games is moving another step closer and to help with preparations we're inviting residents, businesses, schools and organisations across the Borough to start sharing your ideas, priorities and expectations for the Games. The responses received from this survey will help inform the council's planning and investment over 2021 and 2022 – particularly ensuring that the opportunities the Games creates are relevant and accessible to everyone.



The Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games are happening, and take place between 28 July to 8 August. It is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to showcase the West Midlands on the global stage.
