Geography at the Movies, Review for the Half Term.

Films or documentaries I watched.

1. The Impossible.
2. The Flood
3. Chasing Coral
4. A Plastic Ocean

I have always been aware of the environment and the destruction that has been happening but after watching Plastic ocean and Chasing Coral I am truly horrified by the actions of us people as human beings and a society. I found the documentary about 'Plastic Oceans' really sad to know that so many plastics is polluted into the oceans and the destruction it does on all the animals. I was quite horrifying to see the female scientist when she cut open the stomach of the bird and counting out the pieces of plastic and debris that the bird had consumed. Just how would we feel if we consumed 272 pieces off plastic and the record been 278. Even the size and shape of those pieces of plastic, just how did they even get down the windpipe into the stomach of such a small animal.

Then the documentary about 'Chasing Coral' now that did really bring tears to my eyes with the young scientists getting upset and saying what is the point. The fact that he was always interested in how beautiful coral was and taken admiration from other scientists who did televised documentaries when he was a young boy. How the older scientist has seen no change in coral surviving and just getting worse by the day. I have actually seen coral in the ocean when I have been to Egypt and Jamaica and it really is a beautiful array of colours, but to know the detriment the ozone layer has on changing the temperature of the ocean by just 2 degrees, stops the coral from getting photosynthesis and been able to attract fish for the fish to feed the coral for the coral then to feed and continue to grow. I knew that there is white coral and when its sort of dying but not quite it turns white before its completely green or black and died. With there been no coral affects the marine life that is in the water because there is nowhere for them to feed off are hide amongst the coral so the size of how many depletes. I really do believe we should follow suit just like Germany, I have asked my mom if I can write to the MP. To state they we too should have machine put about locally or in supermarkets with ease of access for people to get to where we take back all out plastic packaging and it scans the barcode and lets the machine know which shop or supermarket sold it, the distributor, and we the consumer are paid for returning the plastic and once the plastic has been scanned and taken its then returned back to the supplier for them to get rid of their own plastic to reduce waste. If all waste is not recyclable what is the point of it been packaged and then put into bin bags for it to go to land fill to just sit there rotting creating gases and toxins into the air to affect the environment and birds to die because they are eating the plastic. We need to do more as a society, the councils the governments need to do better with the money for resources, they do all this talking but what are they actually doing that is making a difference. The oneness has been laid too much on us to do more when there is only so much we can do but the bigger companies and businesses could do more.

Thank you sir for that insight into those documentaries some I have seen when they have been on BBC one but I have written them all down and intend to watch the rest at some point, I think if everyone did they would be more aware and more conscious of their own actions of how they treat the world we live in and how they dispose of their rubbish and belonging or recycling products in their home.

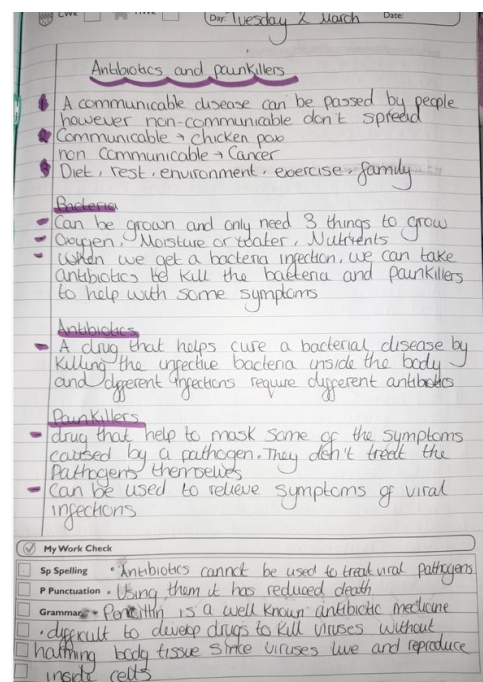
Year 10, Science

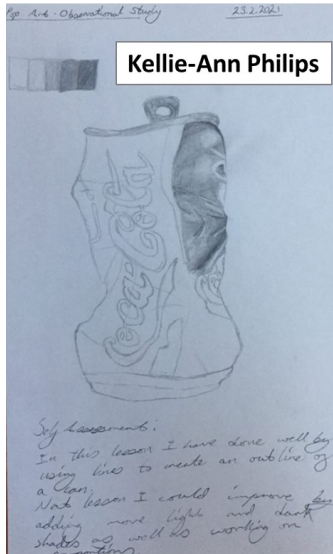




Year 8 have started their new project this week looking at *Pop Art*. They have been researching and looking at various Pop Artists and working in the style of them for their observational drawings.
