Tom Palmer Visits Park Hall

On **Friday 16th June**, Park Hall was extremely lucky to have a visit from award winning author Tom Palmer. There was huge anticipation from Year 7 who have been reading his latest book, Resist, which shines a light on the American actress Audrey Hepburn's involvement with the Dutch resistance in Nazi occupied Holland during WW2.

Tom did not disappoint! Year 7 were mesmerised as they learnt that Tom didn't enjoy reading when he was younger and how he brought together his two loves: football and history to become a best-selling children's author. Tom showed us his planning process when writing a book, told us some fascinating stories of the real-life heroes and animals his books are based on, and signed books and bookmarks for students.

In a reward workshop afterwards, Tom spoke to students from all four schools from the Academy Trust. All Park Hall's Millionaire readers, those who were nominated for academy reading colours and commendations, and those working hard with reading intervention in form were invited.

Tom chose the winner and runner up of our bookmark competition (Alexa Donohoe) and commented on how engaged students were in his sessions, 'there's definitely a reading buzz about the place,' he commented.

What is Eid al Adha?

Eid al Adha is one of the most significant holidays on the Islamic calendar, and is celebrated by millions of Muslims worldwide.

Eid al Adha commemorates the completion of hajj — a pilgrimage to Mecca and its surrounding sites. Every year, in the final month of the Islamic calendar, selected Muslims from around the world travel to Mecca, Saudi Arabia in order to make the hajj.

The hajj is one of the five pillars of Islam, meaning it's one of the top five things a practicing Muslim should do in order to have a connection with God. Hajj is obligatory for every Muslim who can afford to take on the travel

expenses for it.
